





## 1. Introduction

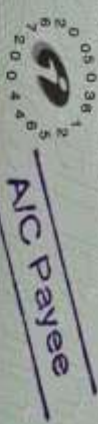

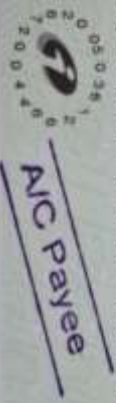
